Dear Parents and Carers

Another week in school has flown by! Last week we celebrated our school Science Week which was very much enjoyed by all the children.

All year groups completed a variety of experiments; plant growing, jelly investigations, playdoh making, jumping colours, making slime, making salt crystals and exploding volcanoes. Years four, five and six even had staff from Valley Park Secondary School to come and help with one of theirs. We have a few photographs to share with you:

Our EYFS children are really enjoying growing beans! The first photo is when they were planted and the second photo is the second week growth. Each week they will be observing them very carefully. Children will spend time discussing what they can see, taking photographs, making their own drawings and measuring how big they get (hopefully not too big!!!) all whilst enjoying Jack and the Beanstalk!!!









In Year One, we investigated whether adding different fruits to jellies affected the time in which it took to set.





Year 2 enjoyed making exploding volcanoes during science week. We used bicarbonate of soda and vinegar to make the volcanoes erupt!



In Year 3, we investigated what happens when you place kitchen roll between containers with liquid and containers without. We learnt about capillary action and colour theory.




In Year 4, we looked at different chemical reactions that occurred when we made slime.

"This is the best experiment ever!" (Year 4 child)

Year 5 had a super session with Valley Park teachers and pupils learning about the scientific processes of evaporation and filtration, making salt crystals that develop over time. The children are looking forward to these evaporating fully and the crystals forming as we hope!



Year 6 also enjoyed their science lesson with our Valley Park visitors!!!

EYFS enjoyed lots of activities around the story of Superworm by Julia Donaldson. We enjoyed watching a live storytelling session with Jane Considine, the creator of our Book Talk and Sentence Stacking lessons in English. Year 1 also joined in with a workshop with Axel Scheffler, the illustrator for our favourite books by Julia Donaldson. We created a large collage linked to the story of the Queen's Hat by Steve Antony. We have loved learning about London! The children got to choose which teacher they would go to at the end of the day for a story time session in year 1 and 2, Mrs Summerton's choice of The Diddle that Dummed was very popular!

Year 2 also enjoyed a book tasting session, with the tables set up as a picnic whilst they wrote book reviews.

The driver carefully reversed the bus into its final place with the help of Mr Hill. It looks good sitting along the path just by the Y1 playground.


It was really exciting to see the bus arrive – we're looking forward to see our brilliant reading bus take shape.
