



## Madginford Primary School Home-School Agreement for Online Learning

This document outlines the steps school adults, parents and children can take to make sure live lessons are safe and support learning.

### School Adults will:

- Make sure that the times of all live lessons will be shared with parents beforehand and are shared on Google Classroom.
- Make sure children are aware of the resources that they might need for the lesson beforehand.
- Make sure that live lessons are kept to a reasonable length of time and take place during normal school hours.
- Use professional and appropriate language and wear clothing that would normally be worn in public.
- Ask children to let their parent/carer know if they have problems before, during or after a lesson.
- End a lesson if there are concerns about children (or other household members) using unsuitable language, being inappropriately dressed or if there are concerns about the locations of the child. Concerns will be recorded and passed to a senior member of staff and/or DSL.

### Parents/carers will:

- Make sure that the location where the child is working is in an appropriate room.
- Make sure the background of the location is neutral and does not show any personal information.
- Be within earshot of their children during the online lesson to help with any problems the child might experience. These may include technical issues with the computer, internet connections or a lack of resources or equipment.
- Be nearby to help maintain their child's focus and concentration
- Use appropriate language during the lesson
- Wear clothing that would normally be worn in public if they are likely to be seen on screen.
- Follow usual school routines to report any concerns.
- Not make any recording or take any screenshots of the live lesson.

### Children will:

- Wear clothing that would normally be worn in public.
- Use polite, appropriate language
- Follow the instructions of the teacher
- Let the teacher know if they have to leave the lesson at any time.
- Take turns and listen to others
- Speak positively and politely to one another.
- Respect the work and ideas of others
- Ask grown-ups for help should it be needed (technical issues etc)
- Make sure they have all the resources they might need ready at the start of the lesson
